Well, we really have got some momentum going now on the project to convert the church building into a community hub! All the necessary planning consents have been granted and the legal agreement to acquire the building has been signed. So, we are now able to really get moving on the work. This means that there are going to be lots of opportunities for Norton residents to become more actively involved. First up, in the next few weeks the building will need to be cleared, including the fixed pews - this is the first major step in creating the necessary space for community use. As you can imagine, we will need some help with these activities, and residents who have registered as volunteers will be contacted shortly with a date for starting on this. If you haven't already registered as volunteer and would like to offer to help, just go to our website and complete the volunteer form -

Meanwhile, we're not done with the behind-the-scenes work yet - a Building Regulations application has been made to Powys Council and when approved this will be the basis for preparing detailed build specifications and inviting tenders for the adaption work from suitably qualified developers.

And on the funding side, work is nearing completion on the grant application to the National Lottery Community Fund for £75,000 to help fund the planned capital work. This has been a big piece of work and we're very grateful to our funding sub-group for putting in the hours and effort on this.

As well as these major applications, we also rely on local donations and fundraising initiatives – including recently a fabulous donation of $\pounds1500$ from Lingen Arts All Inclusive. Thanks also to everyone who

organised and took part in the tombola and raffle at the Jubilee party and the Treasure Hunt over the same weekend - these raised a wonderful £470 in total for the Hub project. And by the way, if you would like to purchase a pew, now is the time to express an interest. The price guide is £100 and the sale proceeds will be shared between the local church PCC and the Hub, with our share going directly towards the cost of new tables and chairs for community use.
