Lots of good news on the fundraising front for you this issue.

Firstly, a big thanks to everyone who showed an interest in the sale of the pews. This has raised a wonderful £1200 to date for the Hub, a really useful sum to put towards the cost of new tables and chairs for community use. (And still a few pews left if anyone is interested.)

In addition, we have also secured a grant from Powys Association of Voluntary Organisations, from their UK Community Renewal Fund, of £2,100. This grant is to help with the cost of our upcoming community meeting in the autumn, some essential fees, and to carry out a survey of best practice and experiences of other local community hubs. More information about those activities to come. We're really grateful to PAVO for awarding us this grant.

And the Lottery application mentioned previously has now been completed and submitted - this is for £75,000, half our estimated build budget. Our volunteer funding sub-group is going to need time to recover from this major piece of work! Our thanks go to them for all their efforts, and fingers crossed for success.

So, the next major fundraising event we have coming up is our Craft Fair on Bank Holiday Monday, 29th August, on Went's Meadow. Last year we made over £1700 and so this is one of our most effective community fundraising events - and we want to make this year just as special. Please come along and support the event - entry to the Fair is FREE! - but of course we will happily accept donations for car parking and throughout the day.

The Craft Fair this year is jointly presented by Norton Show and Norton Community Hub and runs from noon till 5pm, with all proceeds going to Norton Community Hub. There will be lots of attractions for all the family:
